As we return to our series of talks in the Corn Exchange beginning 22 September 2021, I would like to take this opportunity not only to welcome you back but also to explain how your committee are making our meetings as safe as we can.

There are no longer any legal requirements or restrictions for gatherings or meetings and we do not have to provide data for test and trace purposes. However, Covid 19 is still in circulation and there remain some recommendations that we would like to implement with your safety in mind:

- Ventilation: some doors and windows will be open therefore please wear suitable clothing
- Seating: please sit in family groups where possible and leave a chair between you and the next group
- Face coverings: not obligatory but you are welcome to wear them
- Social distancing: please be mindful of the importance of social distancing in crowded spaces and respect the personal space of those around you
- Personal Covid status: we expect all those attending to have received two Covid vaccinations and/or to have had a negative test within the last 3 days. Covid self-test kits are available free from <https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests> or there is a pick-up point beside Hungerford library in the Church St car park Tuesdays and Fridays 9.30am-4pm
- Please stay away if you are unwell or have any symptoms suggestive of Covid infection such as fever, new continuous cough, loss of taste or smell
- Notification of any illness: any person having attended the HHA who becomes unwell with Covid symptoms within seven days should advise Roger Day, membership secretary, or any HHA Committee Member immediately
